# Education Guidelines for LiN Basic Course Trainers



#### Requirements

- Physiotherapist, occupational therapist, registered nurse or registered geriatric nurse, speech therapist
- Proof of at least two years of professional experience with patients who have have limitations in their mobility.
- Participation in a certified LiN basic course
- · Attendance at another LiN basic course
- · Recommendation by a LiN trainer

#### Supervision during the training

A person in training is called an assistant. Each assistant is supervised by at least one mentor. The mentor advises the trainee and evaluates the trainee's project work.

# Requirement for the qualification as LiN trainer for basic courses

## 1. Evaluated and passed assistantships in LiN basic courses

## **Learning Objective:**

To be able to independently organise, lead, and teach a two-day LiN course. Among other things, this requires the following:

- Timely arrangements with the trainer regarding the upcoming assistance.
- Each assistant must have successfully taught the entire content of a course at least once during his or her training. This can take place within the assistantship in a LiN course, during a module, or in a trainer-supervised workshop.
- During the course of his or her training, each assistant must be evaluated by at least two different trainers and at two different facilities.
- During the final assistantship, the assistant conducts the course independently under the supervision of a LiN trainer.



### 2. Participation in the training modules I to III

- Module I: Teaching and presenting
  Learning objective: Gaining methodical-didactical competences and skills for the theoretical and practical teaching
- Module II: Analysing and positioning
  Learning objective: Gaining competences in the analysis, the applying and the reanalysis of the basic course positions
- Module III: Muscular and neurophysiological principles
  Learning objective: Gaining and deepening basic knowledge about relevant neuromuscular interactions and principles.

During the training to become a trainer, assistants must participate in at least one module per year. Otherwise, an evaluated assistantship will not be possible.

#### 3. Ten passed project works in the form of

5 analysis of positions from clinical practice.

**Learning Goal:** Gaining the ability to analyse and name joint positions, muscle tone and deviations from "neutral".

5 different positions in LiN with reanalysis

**Learning objective:** To correctly perform LiN (supine position, 30° and 90° lateral position, stable sitting in bed and in a chair), adapt them individually to a patient, and discuss deviations from neutral and the effects of LiN on the patient.

#### 4. Proof of attendance in a LiN - advanced course.

**Learning Goal:** To acquire knowledge beyond the basic course level in order to feel more confident in teaching basic courses.

#### **Qualification:**

After fulfilling the requirements, Dr. Heidrun Pickenbrock certifies the assistant as a LiN-basic course trainer. This authorises the trainer to conduct basic courses according to the guidelines of the LiN- Arge e.V. and to use the title "Basic Course Trainer for LiN - Positioning in Neutral".

To maintain instructor status, attendance at least every 4th modul is required even after training.

## Costs (preliminary):

Participation in advanced course € 240,- - € 280,-.

Evaluation of at least 10 project works à € 15,-.

Approx. 5 assistantships à € 200,- and approx. 4 training modules à € 150,-.
